Centennial Scholars Entrance Award 2019/20 Student Application

The UBC Centennial Scholars Entrance Award (CSEA) program assist students who are transitioning to UBC from secondary school or another post-secondary institution. The purpose of this program is to financially support academically qualified students who show an interest in joining and contributing to the UBC community, but who would not otherwise be able to attend without significant financial assistance.

Through the program, new students can access a variety of one-time and renewable awards of up to \$40,000, payable over four years. For those studying on UBC's Vancouver campus, there are opportunities to receive full-ride awards that cover up to the full cost of their degree and living expenses.

Criteria

- You are a strong academic student who meets all of UBC's admission requirements.
- You demonstrate financial need.
- You are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
- You are entering UBC directly from high school or transferring from another post-secondary institution.
- You are applying to a direct-entry undergraduate program at UBC and do not have a previous degree.
- You have a reference from a member of your school or community.

Instructions

Please read the instructions carefully before beginning:

- In addition to completing this application, you must apply to UBC using the online application and obtain a UBC student number.
- You must also prepare and upload a description of circumstance (maximum 1,000 words) outlining the financial circumstances that make it necessary for you to apply for a Centennial Scholars Entrance Award. Explain your interest in joining and contributing to the UBC community and how receiving this award will impact your personal situation now and in the future. Consideration will be given to students who demonstrate in addition to academic merit leadership skills, involvement in student affairs, contributions to their family, community or school, and/or recognized achievements in a field(s) of interest.
 - o If you are applying to UBC's Okanagan campus, and would like to be considered for the **Finch Family Entrance Award**, please include details of how you meet the following criteria: *This award support students who have graduated from a high school in British Columbia and who have demonstrated significant financial need, an exceptional work ethic, and academic strength.*
 - o If you are applying to the Faculty of Arts on UBC's Vancouver campus and would like to be considered for the **Meekison Arts Student Entrance Award**, please include details of how you meet the following criteria: *This award supports an academically qualified student with demonstrated leadership skills and an interest in joining and contributing to the UBC community, but who would not be able to attend UBC without significant financial assistance.*
- Once you've completed this application, please upload it and your description of circumstance to the Student Application page.
- Parent/guardian form: If you attended high school within the past 48 months, your parents(s)/guardian(s) must complete the parent/guardian form. They can submit two separate forms, or one form on behalf of both parents/guardians. Completed forms can be uploaded to the <u>UBC Centennial Scholars Entrance Award (Supporting Documentation)</u> page. If you are not in contact with your parent(s)/guardian(s) and you are unable to submit a parent/guardian form for them, please explain in your description of circumstance.
- Reference form: You must have a personal reference complete and upload a reference form to the UBC Centennial Scholars Entrance Award (Supporting Documentation) page. Your personal reference cannot be a family member and must be well acquainted with you and able to comment on your character, interest in UBC, and financial circumstances. Personal references can include, but are not limited to: coaches, teachers, counsellors, principals, supervisors from work or volunteer positions, family doctors, community or religious leaders. Only one reference per applicant will be accepted.

Timeline

Completed applications, including student information, parent/guardian information, and reference, must be received by UBC by **December 1, 2018**.

All applicants who submit an application for the 2019/20 academic year will be notified of UBC's decision by May 15, 2019.
