



## Donald Wehrung International Student Award 2019- 2020 NOMINATION • VANCOUVER & OKANAGAN CAMPUSES

**DEADLINE TO SUBMIT NOMINATION PACKAGE: DECEMBER 1, 2018**

Nominations will be accepted from secondary schools and recognized international development agencies and their affiliates, or registered local or international charitable and not-for-profit organizations. A school or organization may **nominate one student** for UBC’s **Donald Wehrung International Student Award (DWISA)** for undergraduate study at UBC’s Vancouver campus or Okanagan campus.

**NOTE: If a school nominates one student for the Donald Wehrung International Student Award, a non-profit organization may NOT nominate another student from that same school for this award.**

To be eligible for consideration for the Donald Wehrung International Student Award, the nominee must:

- be an international student, who is neither a Canadian citizen nor a permanent resident of Canada, and who will be studying in Canada on a Canadian Study Permit (visa);
- be from a war-torn or politically unstable region of the world, and/or from an economically disadvantaged region of the world, who has achieved academic excellence under difficult circumstances, and who has **no financial means** from family or other sources to pursue post-secondary education, either in their own country because it is unavailable or unattainable, or outside their country because it is beyond their means;
- be graduating or recently graduated from a recognized senior secondary school;
- be applying for their first undergraduate degree;
- be able to demonstrate superior academic achievement (**achieve all ‘A’s** or equivalent standard) and leadership potential.

Convention refugees and students intending to become landed immigrants to Canada are **not** eligible for the Donald Wehrung International Student Award. Nominees who have already entered or completed post-secondary schooling are also **not** eligible for consideration for this award.

Students who win a Donald Wehrung International Student Award will receive an award level commensurate with their financial need as determined by the costs of their UBC tuition and fees, as well as their living and other related costs. The Award can be renewed for up to three additional years of undergraduate study, or to degree completion, whichever is less, provided the student meets UBC Senate requirements for awards renewal, continues to demonstrate financial need, and maintains their Canadian Study Permit (visa).

A student may be nominated for only one award, and will not be considered for the merit-based awards, the Outstanding International Student Award or International Major Entrance Scholarship. Results of the International Scholars competition will be made known by mid-April 2019. **The decision of the International Scholars Selection Committee on all nominations is final.**

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR NOMINEE AND SCHOOL/NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

## THE NOMINEE:

1. **2019 Donald Wehrung International Student Award Nomination Package:**

- (i) Complete all parts of **SECTIONS 1 AND 3**. If you do not have your UBC student number by December 1, leave it blank. We will fill the number in for you.

2. **The Online Admission Application (and special procedure):**

An application to a UBC undergraduate program and a nomination for the Donald Wehrung International Student Award are separate processes, and will be independently evaluated.

Complete an online application for undergraduate admission to UBC at [you.ubc.ca](http://you.ubc.ca). **Use your full legal name exactly as it appears in your passport or other official documentation.**

The normal application procedure requires payment of application fees before the application can be submitted electronically. DWISA nominees **DO NOT** have to pay these fees, and you must therefore follow a special procedure in order to submit your Admission Application.

**Admission Application special procedure:**

- (i) The **nominating school** or organization must first inform us that you are being nominated by They must provide your **first name, middle name(s), surname** and **date of birth** exactly as it will appear in your UBC undergraduate Admission Application, by **December 1, 2018 or earlier**. If you do not have a middle name, leave it blank.
- (ii) You should then visit [you.ubc.ca](http://you.ubc.ca), follow the instructions to create a Campus Wide Login (CWL) account, and then **fully complete** the online Admission Application.
- (iii) You may give first and second choice programs. (Please note that the Bachelor + Master of Management dual degree at Vancouver campus and programs at or jointly offered with other institutions are not open to nominees of the International Scholars program).
- (iv) When the Admission Application has been completed, you should 'save' it **and** 'submit' it, but **DO NOT** pay the application fee. After you submit your application, you will be given your UBC student number. This number should be included in the nomination submission where indicated, and **used in all correspondence** with UBC.
- (v) Email us at [international.awards@ubc.ca](mailto:international.awards@ubc.ca) that you have been nominated for the DWISA and have completed your application. **Provide your first name, surname and UBC student number**. UBC will waive the application fee on your behalf. Due to the volume of nominations, this may take 1-2 weeks.

**Required Documents for Undergraduate Admission:**

- (i) Transcripts: see (3) in the School/Non-Profit Organization section.
- (ii) All nominees must satisfy the University's English Language Admission Standard (ELAS) – see [you.ubc.ca](http://you.ubc.ca). Official test scores must be sent directly to UBC by the testing agency and be received at UBC by **January 31, 2019**.

3. **Online Application for Student Residence:**

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** The student residence application fee is **NOT** waived for DWISA nominees. **DO NOT** complete the Residence application on the Housing website. Successful nominees are responsible for applying for housing before the housing application deadline of **May 1, 2019** at [www.housing.ubc.ca](http://www.housing.ubc.ca).

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR NOMINEE AND SCHOOL/NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

**SCHOOL/NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION:**

1. The **nominating school** or organization must email UBC at [international.awards@ubc.ca](mailto:international.awards@ubc.ca) and provide the full legal name and date of birth of their nominee, by **December 1, 2018 or earlier**. Provide your full name, position at the school/organization, school/organization name, address, email address and phone number.
2. The nominating school/non-profit organization must complete **Sections 2.1 – 2.3**. Only references from the three referees shown will be accepted. Family members or friends cannot serve as references.

**3. Required Documents for Undergraduate Admission:**

After the online application is complete, UBC will send the applicant an acknowledgement email detailing what documents are required. **Nominees must ensure their school is aware of these document requirements.** For timely evaluation of the Admission Application, we ask that schools **submit the requested documents, if available, with the nomination package**, by the **deadline of December 1, 2018**. If transcripts and/or certificates are not available by this date, the **student may upload** the document(s) to their admissions application if this option is available, or the school may email a certified copy of the document(s) to [international.awards@ubc.ca](mailto:international.awards@ubc.ca) by **January 31, 2019**. **The document deadline given by Undergraduate Admissions does not apply to Donald Wehrung International Student Award nominees.**

- (i) **Transcript(s):** Grades 9 to 11 and Grade 12 interim/mid-year transcript and if applicable, mock, pre-board or predicted final grades for courses that are still in progress. In British-patterned education, certified copies of GCSE 'O' Level, GCE 'AS', 'A' Level certificates, and predicted 'AS' or 'A' Level grades from the original examining school(s) are required. If a student has completed high school, submit a final transcript and the secondary school certificate. A certified copy must bear the original school stamp and signature of an official.

**The UBC Admissions Office will accept scanned transcripts and certificates that are uploaded by the student or emailed by the school. Following the selection process, UBC will require the Award recipient and their school to supply official transcripts and certificates.**

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** Transcripts must be in the original language of instruction. If the transcript is in a language other than English or French, a certified translation by a recognized translation agency must be provided.

- (ii) **A school profile** or description of the institution the nominee is currently attending, if available.

**Submitting the Donald Wehrung International Student Award Nomination Package**
