# **PROCEDURES:**

- 1. Submit completed form to the Indigenous Gathering Space (IGS), Room C140, Langara College. If you are unable to drop off the form during normal business hours, please email indigenous@langara.ca.
- 2. Meet with a member of the IGS team for a transition plan meeting. The transition plan meeting is intended to collaboratively review the following:
  - a. Langara program requirements and UBC program of choice entry requirements;
  - b. Scholarship and bursary availability for Indigenous students;
  - c. Identification of goals that support a transition to UBC.
- 3. Coordinate a meeting with one of the Indigenous Liaison Counsellors by emailing indigenous@langara.ca for course selection and other advising assistance.

## BENEFITS OF THE UBC-LANGARA ABORIGINAL TRANSFER PARTNERSHIP:

- Guaranteed entry to UBC faculty of choice provided faculty requirements are met;
- Dedicated scholarships from Langara to Indigenous students who meet basic criteria;
- Entrance scholarships and awards from UBC to Indigenous students who meet set criteria;
- At least 2 UBC information sessions at Langara a year, including transfer information from participating faculties;
- Guided tour of UBC campus for Langara students;
- Community support throughout studies at Langara and at UBC.
