Deadlines for distributed learning courses


Distributed learning courses are online or distance learning courses offered by a distributed learning provider.

If you're taking distributed learning courses to meet your degree requirements, they must be complete by June 30.





Students considered for the Presidential Scholars Award typically present a minimum grade average of over 93%.
