Bachelor of Design in Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Urbanism (Vancouver)

The Bachelor of Design in Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Urbanism is a cross-disciplinary program that explores how design shapes culture, society, and the environment across scales ranging from the body to the city. Through small studios, hands-on learning, and engagement with Vancouver's communities and sustainable design culture, students build the critical and practical skills needed to pursue graduate studies or diverse careers in the design professions.

What type of student succeeds in this degree program?

- Passionate about architecture, landscape architecture or urban design and curious about how design influences people, places, and the environment across scales.
- Enjoys hands-on, creative problem-solving and wants to combine critical thinking with practical skills.
- Wants to engage with real-world issues like sustainability, cultural change, and social impact.

What are the strengths of this program?

- Only undergraduate program in Canada, and one of few in the world, that fully integrates architecture, landscape architecture, and urbanism throughout the degree, allowing students to explore design across scales and disciplines.
- Taught by internationally recognized experts, with small studio and seminar classes that maintain a low student-to-faculty ratio, creating opportunities for personalized mentorship and meaningful engagement.
- Experiential learning opportunities such as study abroad, the Coordinated International Experience (CIE), Co-op, and design-build projects allow students to apply their skills in real-world contexts, gain global perspectives, and collaborate directly with industry.
- Vancouver, recognized as a global leader in sustainable urbanism, serves as a dynamic "living lab" for the program, allowing students the opportunity to learn from cutting-edge design projects and explore innovative approaches to sustainable urban development.


UBC's admission process is competitive and comparative. Keep in mind that your application will be evaluated against all of the others we have received this year for the same degree.



- Canadian curriculum students will be part of a new ongoing admissions process.
- Students can apply after early October and their application will be reviewed shortly after we have all the information needed to make an assessment.
- If we are unable to make an offer, updated grade 12 grades will be requested, and a subsequent review will be conducted. These reviews will typically take place in March-April.
- Due to competitiveness of UBC programs not everyone will receive an offer after the first review.
- The IB Diploma candidate process will remain the same. Students will be evaluated on anticipated grades when available in February.
- Dec 1st deadline is still in place for domestic scholarship & award considerations!
